Approve Agenda: Laurie Marshall moves to approve Minutes from February. Caroline Tees seconds. Council approves.

<u>ProGrant:</u>

- Paul Grant has been booked for Thursday May 20, 2021 @ 8pm. Meeting will include parents and Gr 7/8 students. We can have up to 200 people on the Zoom meeting. Council considers asking Queen Elizabeth to join our *Internet Safety* meeting.
- Meeting cost for just parents is \$500.00, there is an additional fee of \$350 for the Gr. 7/8. Council agrees that it is very important for the Gr. 7/8 to be involved.
- Laurie Marshall moves to have School Council pay up to \$350 for the presentation. Krystyna seconds the motion. The whole Council votes in favour of paying \$350.00 towards the *Internet Safety* meeting.
- Laurie will ask Q.E to join us.
- Laurie shares a flyer with Council that will be shared home with families. The flyer will include the link for the Zoom meeting.

- Council resumes discussion from last month about continuing the program.
- All agree it is nice to have the option, once in a while, to not make lunch.
- Another nice feature is that it requires very little parent support at the school to run – and it was possible to distribute easily in a way that follows Public Health protocols.
- Council acknowledges that there are issues of equity that we need to take into account as well. All members agree that it is problematic that not everyone can participate, as it excludes students who do not have the financial resources to order from the Lunchbox Program.
- Laurie opens a discussion on other possible options if we choose to not use Lunchbox anymore. Laurie has contacted some local pizza places for pricing and inclusive to all options. Prices are ranging from \$1.50 per slice to \$3.95 with slight increase in cost for Vegan or Gluten-free options. The big question is: How would we be able to follow all Public Health Covid-19 protocols to distribute it?
- Discussion ensued about a possible June pizza day for whole school for year end. Council likes this idea. Laurie moves to look into a school wide pizza day in June. Krystyna seconds he motion. Council agrees. Laurie will start to organize something and return to council with more information.
- Do we continue forward with Subway through Lunchbox as they have already been approved by Public Health? Council is unsure at this time and will discuss for next year, maybe as an occasional thing.
